

Golo-Missebo Public Elementary School

District of Golo,
Community of Abomey-Calavi
Republic of Benin

Golo-Missebo is a little town within the community of Abomey-Calavi in the district of Golo. The municipality of Abomey-Calavi is located in the department of Atlantique in southern Benin. The district of Golo is located north of the city of Calavi and has approximately 31,000 inhabitants. Missebo has about 6,080 residents today, about half of whom are children and adolescents. The population feeds on trade, small handicrafts and agriculture. Some people commute to the city of Calavi to earn a living there.

To get to the elementary school, you drive from Cotonou on the main road northwards past Godomey, Calavi and Akassato. After the market of Golo-Djigbe, take the first street on the left. The school can be found on the right-hand side of the street after a short distance.

The public elementary school of Golo-Missebo now houses three groups due to the large number of students. Group C was registered under number N ° 1030 / MEFDP / MEMP / DC / SGM / DPP / SP on November 28, 2014. Group C teaches 160 children, including 83 girls. Group C has one solid building holding three classrooms. The students of the other three classes have been divided and are taught together with the children of the groups A and B.

The Mayor of Abomey-Calavi asked us to construct a building holding three classrooms, an office and a storage room for this fast growing school.

The school has two toilet annexes with four cabins each.

We suggest to construct

1. one building with three classrooms, office, storage room and closets for the teaching material

Cost: 35,000 €

2. a toilet block with eight cabins

Cost: 8,000 €

3. Costs for building inspection: 5,000 €

The total cost for this project is 48,000 €
