One person asked when the work will start. When I answered that work would start the following day, people were very astonished. They doubted if I meant it.

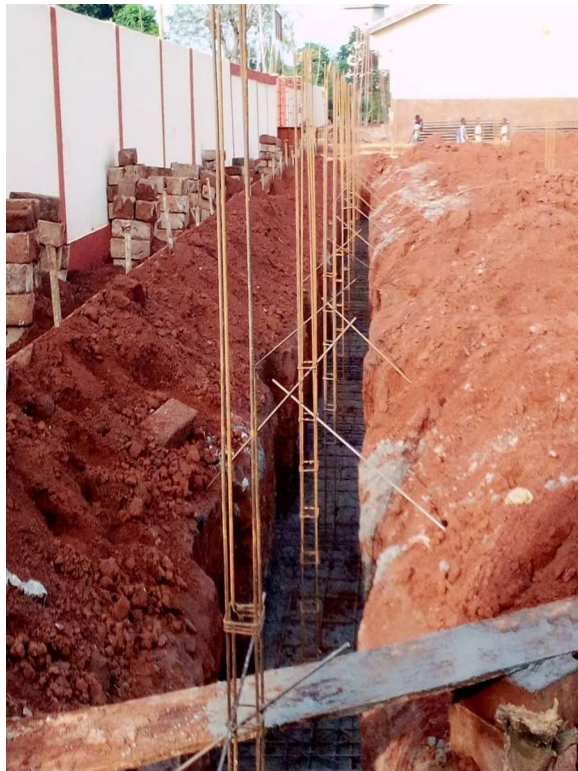
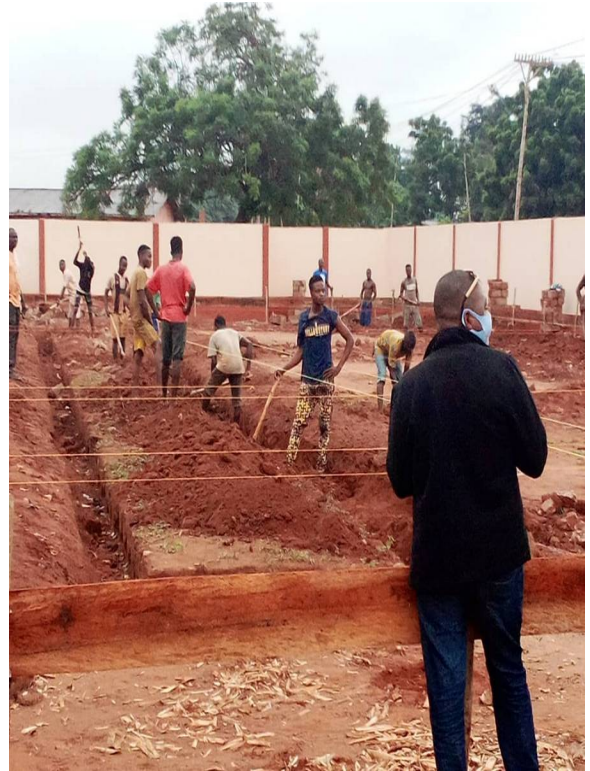
After we split, I ordered sand, gravel, iron, and cement. Everything was delivered on September 2nd while we were in the process of surveying the building site to implant the new building.

After the walls of the building had dried well, the carpenters made the wooden roof structure and put on asbestos-free panels.



And then the masons began to plaster the walls of the building.
